Set close to the historic main street, the Lockhart Water Tower Mural, depicting a cascading waterfall surrounded by many of the unique native fauna and flora found in the local landscape, has rapidly become one of the most incredible pieces of public art in the Riverina.

The Mural depicts an old telephone, Tootool Public School badge, the old Tootool Bridge, native flora and fauna, along with a representation of the infamous “Swaggie,” that was known to the Tootool – French Park area.

Located in the small village of Milbrulong between The Rock and Lockhart. The Milbrulong Water Tower Mural features the bird rosella, which pays homage to the village name and the Wiradjuri heritage which Milbrulong being the Wiradjuri word for “rosella”.

The beautiful and bright Yerong Creek Water Tower Mural dominates the skyline and provides the perfect canvas to highlight the story of local life and history “through the eyes” connecting the past, present and future. The story of ‘Through Their Eyes’ aims to celebrate life in and around this rural village, depicting the cultural and social fabric. The mural features six main elements: Agriculture, Education, Indigenous Culture, Military, Sport and Transport.
